"Valentine" Portable Typewriter ,1969

- -made of plastic, rubber, metal
- -extremely light weight
- -designed more for aesthetics than for practicality
- -design statement
- -italian design
- -inspired by **pop art**
- -influenced by Sottsass's travel throughout India and the U.S
- -a result of Italy's plastic revolution
 (part of italy's industrial design in the 1960's)

RISD museum display



- displayed in a glass case
- not tangible
- viewer cannot experience the main characteristics (weight, texture, practicality, colors)
 all of which are considered to be unconventional
- hard to see the details

IDEA #1

design a pop art style "room" or exhibition

design a room where most of the components are based on aesthetics

- help the type writer and chair blend in with the rest of the objects in the room
- incorporate some Olivetti Posters
- include (non functioning) props that help accentuate the visual qualities of the two pieces
- utilize **color**
- create a "room" like space or at least a partition
- make sure the audience can get a full 100% view of pieces
- think about the viewer's experience







- Create a space where the type writer can blend in (surroundings have similar pop-art qualities)
- use paintings, posters and wall decorations to accentuate pop art qualities
- use of color (bright colors + white)
- place typewriter on a desk where audience can actually sit down and type on the typewriter in an office/room setting





IDEA # 2


- Create an all-white, minimalistic space
- room consists of no other furniture other than desk and chair (for audience to sit and experience)
- using almost nothing to create a space, the typewriter is able to stand out and pop out from its setting, allowing the viewer to visually focus on the type writer.





IDEA # 2_2

- create an all white, minimalistic space
- instead of creating an entire room, build a partition or create walls to create a small, intimate space
- when viewer walks into space, there are no other additions to the space other than a white podium and Valentine Typewriter



sound effects

 use sound to highlight the unique qualities of typewriter typing paper space bar etc.

- use songs from the pop-art era as background music ex: Pop Art: Underground Sounds from the Warhol Era
